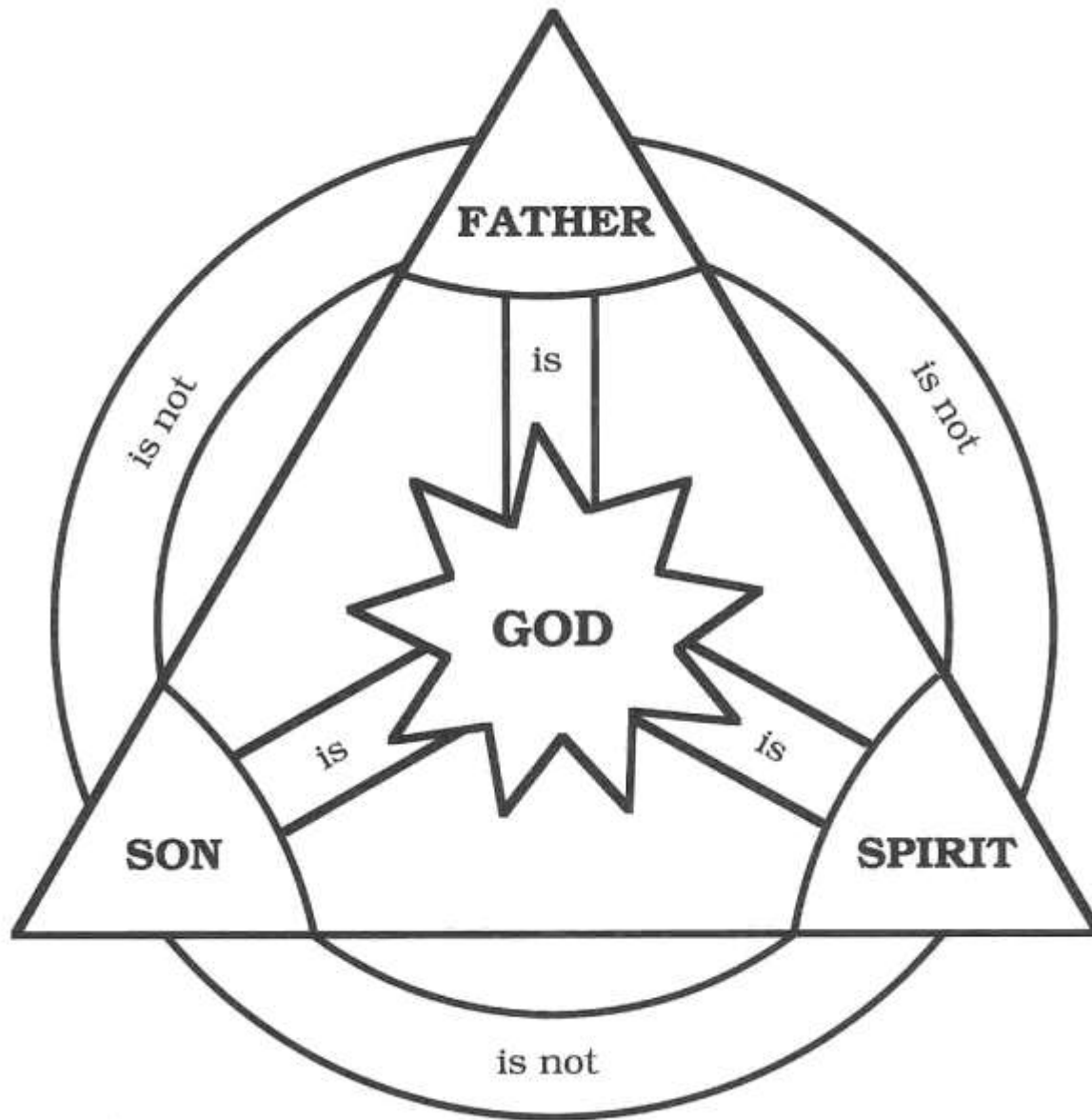
Summary

3 Truths

1. There is one living and true God, who eternally exists in three persons that are equal in every divine perfection. We refer to this as the “Trinity”. *(Mt. 28:18-19, Jn. 1:1-4, 1 Jn. 5:7)*





3 Truths

2. Jesus is God, the only begotten son of the Father conceived by the Holy Spirit. He took on human flesh, was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, and died for the sins of the world. He then rose again in the flesh and ascended to heaven. (*Is. 7:14, Jn. 1:14, Phil. 2:5-11, 1 Thess. 4:16-17, Heb. 1:2-3, 1 Jn. 1:7*)

3 Truths

3. The Bible is the Word of God. It is fully inspired and without error in the original manuscripts and written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. (*1 Jn. 17:17, Rom. 15:4, 2 Tim. 3:16-17, 2 Pet. 1:19-21*)

1. God exists in the trinity
2. Jesus is God, the Son of the Father
3. The Bible is the Word of God

Genesis 1:26-28 (NKJV)

²⁶ Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." ²⁷ So God created man in His *own* image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.



Jesus' perspective

1. To destroy Satan's work
2. To demonstrate His love

The Old Testament

- **God established the law to show us our need for redemption** (Romans 10:4, Galatians 3:19-25)
- **He established sacrifices to show us the cost** (Hebrews 9:22, Psalm 49:7-8)
- **Jesus was the perfect sacrifice** (2 Corinthians 5:21, Hebrews 7:27)
- **Old Testament prophecy is constantly pointing to Jesus** (Isaiah 52, Psalm 22)

Ephesians 1:7-10 (NIV)

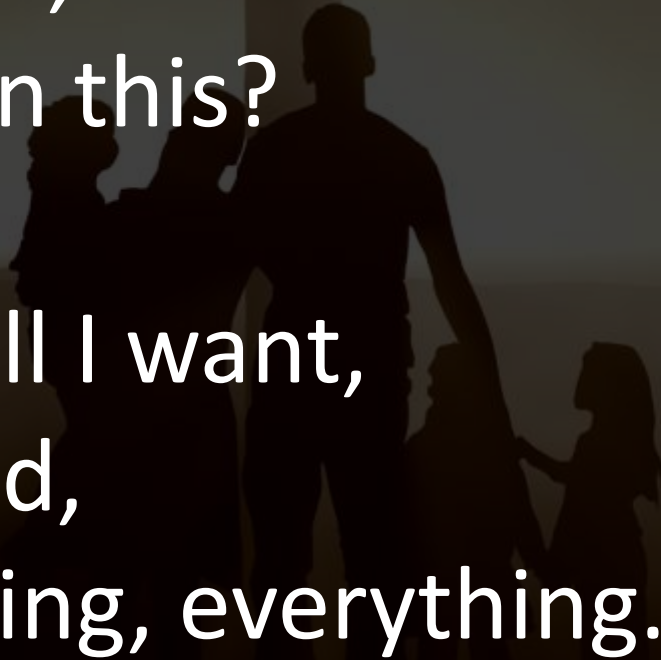
⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace ⁸ that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and understanding, ⁹ he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, ¹⁰ to be put into effect when the times reach their fulfillment—to bring unity to all things in heaven and on earth under Christ.

1. To destroy Satan's work
2. To demonstrate His love

4. To bring us back into unity with God
5. To demonstrate God's Justice
6. To demonstrate God's righteousness
7. To prove God's Word and His promises

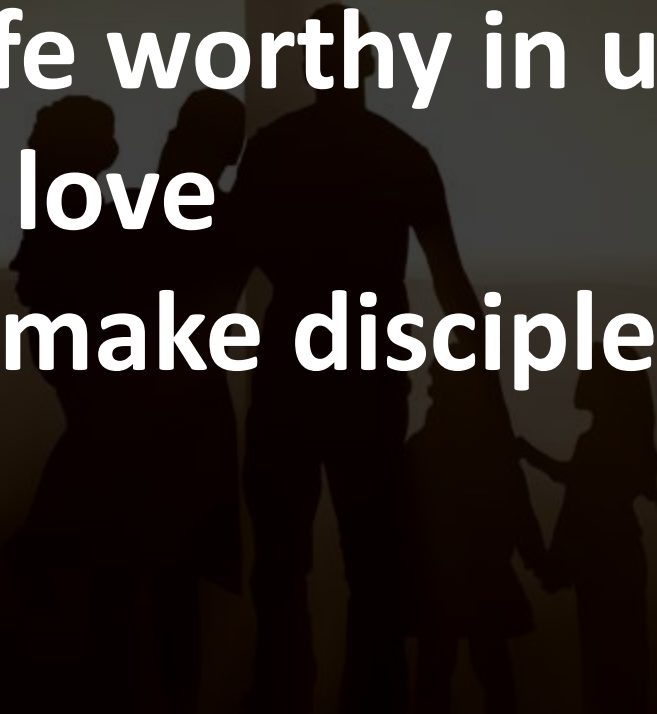
